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Implementing The Carers Act in North Lanarkshire







Duties: 1. 2. 3. 4.

New duties:

- Adult carers support plans & young carers statements
- Support to carers based on need which meets local eligibility criteria
- Emergency and future planning
- Information and advice services
- Consider the need for short breaks and produce a Short Break Services Statement
- Involve carers in hospital discharge
- Adhere to timescales for adult carers of terminally ill
- Prepare a local carers strategy

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Adult Carer Support Plans

- Conversational approach
- Support provided to the cared-for person
- Impact of caring on carer's life
- Health
- Relationships
- Finances
- Social/recreational time
- Ability to work or access education or training
- Other daily activities
- Any other aspects linked to their caring role.
- Ability to have a life of their own
- Carer's identified needs and personal outcomes
- Short breaks
