Ponies Help Children predominantly work with children. Working with the ponies can help people to learn to trust and build relationships, build emotional connections, cultivate positive physical and mental health while promoting social inclusion. We run a block of sessions where the client will come for up to an hour each week for approx. 7 weeks. The sessions include grooming, lead work and generally developing a relationship and trust with the pony. We help with children and adults who have Autism, ADHD, Attachment Disorder, PTSD, ACE, anxiety and depression which can lead to suicidal thoughts. The costs of these sessions are £10 each. Note: the parents who facilitate the group have qualifications in Autism.

They meet on Tuesdays 10:30-12:30 excluding the 3rd Tuesday in the Daisy Park Community Centre; they also meet on the 3rd Tuesday of each month 7pm-9pm in an effort to reach folks who are working during the day

Hope for Autism

HOPE for Autism was established in 2002 by a group of mothers who were unable to access the help they needed for their children with Autism Spectrum Disorder in North Lanarkshire.

HOPE provides a tiered support service that includes 25 weekly activity groups for children and young adults aged from 2 to 25 years.

various sports groups out in the community and advocacy and training for families. HOPE's groups are fun and educational and take place over 6 days each week. Our services also offer training and support for other organisations and for professional practitioners to help them support people with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Membership and Group Packages

accessing support services requires joining up to our basic membership package for £30 a year. This membership package includes:

Individual support for families all year round

Monthly parent/Carer support group meetings

Weekly siblings activity groups

Advocacy service

Access to training courses

Benefits, grants, and service advice

Access to HOPE's resource library

Member's only online forum

For access to groups and activity sessions families pay a weekly fee of £6.00

£30 membership fee

£6 x 44 for weekly sessions = £264 + £30 membership fee is £294 annually

£6 x 22 for fortnightly sessions = £132 + £30 membership fee is £162 annually

Weekly sessions are available from pre-school children up to young adults. Spaces in our groups are subject to availability. Those who cannot be placed will be added to a waiting list and will be contacted when a place becomes available. Where families have two

children/young people accessing groups, HOPE will only include the basic membership fee of £30 once per family.

Membership packages are processed by Standing Order. Sports Groups are £3.50 per session. These include swimming, football, trampoline, racquet sports, and cycling among others. The Salvesen Mindroom Centre is a charity working throughout Scotland to support children and young people up to the age of 25 years with learning difficulties and their families. We provide a direct help and support service offering 1:1 practical and emotional support for parents and carers. We help parents and carers to understand their rights, build relationships with professionals and access the support that they need for themselves and their child. This might be about education, health or social work, or other worries about their child. We also have a children and young people's advocacy worker who works directly with children and young people. Your child does not need a diagnosis to access our services.
