VIP Pass Mini Launch - Garden Project Update

On 10th June 2025, VIP Pass – Carer Breather Organisation–hosted a mini launch event at their garden project, located within the grounds of Viewpark Fire Station. This welcoming green space already supports a variety of groups and individuals, and the event marked the beginning of a new initiative to engage carers with a passion for gardening. Our very own Helen - CSN development worker attended this fantastic launch.

Four carers attended on the day, with plans underway to establish a regular gardening group specifically for carers. The space also benefits carers of people living with dementia, as a well-established Tuesday group offers them valuable respite time while their loved ones participate in meaningful activities.

Additionally, local schoolchildren access the garden project through children's mental health and wellbeing funding, further enriching the intergenerational and inclusive nature of the space

Campaigning - Carer Aware Workshop

As part of Carers Week, Carolanne and Iram delivered a bespoke Carer Aware workshop to 24 newly appointed Carer Champions. All participants had previously completed the one-hour Mental Health, Learning Disabilities, and Addictions awareness session. This follow-up workshop aimed to further equip them with practical tools and resources to support unpaid carers in their roles.

The session was extremely well received, with one participant sharing, "Thank you for today's session, it has been extremely helpful and informative."

A powerful highlight of the workshop was a contribution from our board member, Karen McKeown, who shared her personal experience of the challenges she faced in accessing support while caring for her partner. Her story left a strong and lasting impact on the audience.

PARENT CARER FORUM Parent Carer Forum launch event took place at Old Monkland Community Centre Coatbridge. The event began with a welcome from NLCT Manager Colin Smith, followed by guest carers Fiona Graham and Lesley Leishman, who spoke about their experiences and the importance of the forum. Helen, Carer Support Network gave a presentation on Carer Breather short breaks, and Laura from Little Care Hub led a creative wellbeing activity. The event concluded with discussion around shaping the future of the forum and lunch. This event was well attended by 24 carers and 13 professionals.







NO NEED TO FALL CONSULTATION 8 unpaid carers (14 participants in total) took part in Phase 3 of the No Need to Fall research, hosted at Forgewood Community Centre. It was a fantastic opportunity for carers to share their ideas and shape what a future digital resource could look like. Two more sessions are planned for 2025 to build on this momentum and ensure carers' voices continue to guide the project.





This year's annual Carer Positive Partnership event was hosted online via Microsoft Teams, bringing together 14 participants from across sectors, including the Community Liaison Team, Lanarkshire Deaf Hub, NHS Lanarkshire, and North Lanarkshire Carers Together.

The session featured a powerful and honest contribution from our own Helena, who shared her lived experience of balancing work and caring responsibilities—highlighting the real challenges faced by working carers. NLCT also shared their good practice story, outlining how our organisation continues to embed carer-friendly policies and create a supportive working environment.

There was strong engagement and valuable discussion throughout, reflecting a shared commitment to improving outcomes for working carers. A follow-up meeting has been arranged for July to explore the potential of establishing a Carer Positive peer support network within North Lanarkshire.

- Our content reached 2,110 people with 8,717 views.

- We had 7 new followers in Carers Week
- Our best performing post was the promotion of the hospital information stalls in conjunction with our partners which reached 987 people, had 1,727 views and 22 interactions in total
- The AGM video reached 446 people with 763 views and 43 interactions, with a total of 3h 15 minutes viewing time
